This funding also allows your child to receive free school meals throughout their time here at school until they leave in Year 6.

Before/After School Club.

Please can we remind you that you must book your child into before and after school club to ensure they have a place.

If your place is not needed, and you don't inform school, you will still be charged for it.

We must have booking forms for all pupils.

Our club is very busy and only has 45 places, when we are full, we are full!

We do notify all families when club is full by text.

If your child is left at school without being booked into our club and contact cannot be made to parents/carers, children's social care may be called.

The child's family will also incur a penalty charge for late pick up/abandonment.

Changes to Healey School PE lesson and PE kit.

From January 2026 we will be changing the way our PE lessons work at Healey.

On the days when your child has PE they will be able to come to school in their PE kit – this way the pupils are already dressed for their lesson. There is no lost lesson time due to changing into and out of PE kit, there is also less likelihood of parts of your child's school uniform going missing whilst changing for PE.

On PE days pupils must come to school in a white t shirt, black shorts (warm days) jogging bottoms/leggings (cold days, outdoors) and pumps/trainers.

From January we are going to enhance our PE uniform by adding a Healey School Hoodie in Royal Blue – these are available at Moses Schoolwear for £13.99

Children will be able to wear this on the days when they have PE or they can continue to wear their school jumper or cardigan over their t-shirt.
